### Trash & Recycling Updates

#### Curbside Program Changes

Christmas trees will no longer be collected via the weekly bulky item collection. Natural Christmas Trees will be collected seasonally during a two week period following the New Year's Holiday. Artificial trees may still be disposed of via the weekly bulky item collection (year-round). See page 3 for details.

#### Never miss your collection day again!

The Andover Department of Public Works has an app called Andover MA Solid Waste that makes it easier for residents to know how to dispose of specific items, view collection schedules and stay updated on any service changes or delays. # CURBSIDE

## REGULATIONS

- All trash and recycling must be curbside by 7 AM on your scheduled day, no more than 6 ft from the roadway  
Items placed on private property WILL NOT be picked up
- Truck routes and timing are subject to change without notice during the day
- Trash is collected weekly
- Recycling is collected bi-weekly
- Yard waste is collected seasonally, 6 weeks in the spring, 6 weeks in the fall (view page 3 for details)
- **\*NEW\* Christmas Tree Collection is now seasonal, the collection will occur 2 weeks after New Year's Day**
- Items buried under snow WILL NOT be picked up
- Weather related delays, call 978-623-8701, sign up for CodeRed for automatic notices (visit [AndoverMA.Gov/CodeRed](http://AndoverMA.Gov/CodeRed) for more information on CodeRed), visit our website, or view our Solid Waste App (view page 4 for more information on this app)
- Please see pages 6 & 7 for the schedule and the list of Holidays that will affect the schedule. Collections following listed holidays will be one day later
- No trash and recycling container should weigh more than 50lbs at any time

## TRASH COLLECTION

**Containers:** The Town does not supply trash containers. Residents are free to use whatever containers they choose as long as they weigh less than 50lbs when full (drivers manually lift containers). Residents may also place bags curbside. Trash in barrels must be bagged; no loose trash. **To avoid a missed pickup, please do not use paper yard waste bags, contractor bags, or blue containers (unless navy or darker) for curbside trash collection.**

**Limits:** Household trash is limited to 4 bags or barrels, no more than 50lbs each, or the equivalent of 135 gallons maximum per residence. No "business" trash accepted.

**Bulky Items:** Residents are also allowed **one bulk item per week** as part of their regular trash service. Please see page 3 for more details.

**Bundled Branches:** Residents' branches are allowed in the weekly trash pickup, (subject to limitation of 3-4 bundles, counts as your weekly bulky item). Please see page 3 for more details.

### The following **CANNOT** be put curbside for trash collection:

- Appliances/White Goods
- Construction/Demo Debris
- Gas Cylinders - All Types
- Hazardous Waste (see Page 9)
- Lawn Mowers/Snowblowers
- Lead Acid /Lithium/Rechargeable Batteries
- Mattresses/Box Springs (since 2022)
- Mercury Items
- Oil Based Paint, Varnishes, Solvents
- Recyclables
- Textiles
- Treadmills/Exercise Bikes/Ellipticals etc.
- TVs and Electronics
- Water Heaters
- Wet Paint/Cans (see Page 3)
- Leaves/Yard Waste (a separate collection - See page 3)

# CURBSIDE

## ITEMS WITH SPECIFIC PREPARATION/CONSIDERATION

### BULKY ITEMS

Residents are allowed **ONE** bulky item per week with their regular household trash.\* Bulky items include, but are not limited to: sofas, loveseats, chairs, recliners, armchairs, tables, desks, bookcases, carpeting.

*\*Place bulk items out on your collection day; trucks often come back for large bulk items and can be as late as the following day. Avoid setting out upholstered items on rainy days.*

- **Treadmills/Exercise Bikes/Ellipticals etc. are NOT considered bulky items**
- **Construction Debris is NOT considered a bulky item**
- **Natural Christmas Trees are no longer part of the bulky item collection (see seasonal collections below)**

### BASKETBALL HOOPS

Basketball hoops must be taken apart, items must not be longer than 5ft in length. Remove water or sand from base if applicable.

### BUNDLED BRANCHES

Branches are allowed in the weekly trash pickup as your bulky item (subject to limitation of 3-4 bundles) and must be bundled with tape or rope as follows:

- Up to 6" in diameter
- 50lbs or less
- up to 4' in length
- No foliage

**Do not put in bags of any kind**

### CARPETING/RUG PREPARATION

Carpet must be cut into 3'-4' widths, rolled then taped or roped together and each bundle must weigh less than 50lbs. Loose carpeting will not be accepted.

*One Room Carpet = One Bulky Item  
Area Rugs - Please roll up and tie or tape - must not be longer than 5ft*

### PAINT

Latex, acrylic, or any paint that specifies it can be **cleaned with soap and water** is accepted with your trash if **completely dried**:

- Remove cover and allow paint to dry
- Place stick inside can and stir occasionally to eliminate skin formation and to aid drying time
- For faster drying add kitty litter or commercially available drying agents to paint
- **Cover must be removed when placed curbside** so that the dried paint is visible

### GRILLS

Freestanding grills can be put out as your one bulk item. Propane tanks, charcoal or any other **fuel must be removed**. **No built-in grills - outdoor/free standing only.**

## CURBSIDE SEASONAL COLLECTIONS

### CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

**Christmas Trees will be collected the two weeks following the New Year's Holiday (see page 7 for the schedule).** Place out for collection on your regular collection day. Please remove all decorations and place tree curbside next to your trash on your pickup day. One tree per household per week. The truck will be a separate truck than the one collecting household trash.

- Trees over 7' in height must be cut in half
- Trees frozen in snow banks will not be picked up
- All decorations, stands, or metal anchors must be removed
- **Natural trees only - artificial trees can be placed out for year-round bulky item collection**

### LEAF COLLECTION

Curbside leaf collection will occur for 6 weeks in the fall and 6 weeks in the spring:

**FALL** - The 5 weeks before Thanksgiving and one week following Thanksgiving week. **NO collection during the week of the Thanksgiving holiday**

Leaves accepted ONLY if:

- In open barrels or -
- Brown paper leaf compost bags
- Each bag/barrel weighs 50lbs or less
- **NO PLASTIC BAGS**
- No rocks, stones, stumps roots, or branches

**SPRING** - The 5 weeks before Memorial Day and the week of Memorial Day. Please see Pages 6 & 7 for the calendar

Please Note:

- The leaf collection truck is a **separate truck** than the household trash truck
- During high volume weeks, collections can sometimes fall behind. Please **leave your bags/ barrels curbside** until they are collected to avoid a missed pickup

# CURBSIDE RECYCLING COLLECTION

**SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING** (*Residents may also separate materials if preferred for organizational purposes*) Allowable items of Mixed Paper, Glass, Plastic and Metals may be combined in a Blue Bin or personal container(s) with Red Recycling Stickers (see below). **PLASTIC BAGS ARE NOT AN ACCEPTABLE CONTAINER.**

**Containers:** Blue, 18 gallon Recycling Bins may be picked up at the Municipal Services Facility located at 5 Campanelli Drive, Monday-Friday 8:00am-3:30pm. For curbside or after hours pickup, call 978-623-8701 or email [recycle@andoverma.us](mailto:recycle@andoverma.us) to set up a date and time.

**TIP:** You can use any container you choose for recycling as long as it weighs less than 50lbs when full and is clearly marked as recycling with 2 Red Recycle Stickers affixed, one on each side. The Town does not *currently*\* supply trash receptacles or any other recycling container besides the 18 gallon bins (**\*changes to this program expected to start FY26**).

**Limits:** There is NO LIMIT on curbside recycling but each container or bundle must weigh less than 50lbs.

**Cardboard:** Please break down\*, remove any tape or packing materials, flatten and fold boxes, cartons & other pieces of cardboard into 3' x 3' x 2' **bundles** (must weigh less than 50lbs), then tie or tape them together & place next to your bin. **\*Boxes not broken down will NOT be picked up.**

## PLEASE KEEP THESE ITEMS OUT OF YOUR BIN!

To avoid contaminating truck loads, recycling is subject to rejection at the curb.

**DO NOT place plastic bags, wraps, films or pouches OF ANY KIND in your recycling bin, or use them to bag recyclable items.**

- Any Black or Very Dark Plastic
- Any Carton (milk, juice, soup, wine)
- Any Compostable Plastic
- Any Item Marked #6 or #7
- Any Item With Food Residue
- Anything 2" or Smaller, or Smaller than a Credit Card
- Clothing or Linens (see page 10)
- Foods and Liquids
- Frozen Food Boxes
- Garden Hoses, String Lights, Ropes or other "Tanglers"
- Hot Coffee Cups (all types)
- Napkins, Tissues, Towels or Wipes
- Non-food or Beverage Glass
- Plastic Bags, Wraps, Films or Pouches
- Shredded Paper
- Tarps, or Plastic Sheeting

**About Recycle Symbols:** The numbers on plastics within the chasing arrows are resin codes, and are **not great indicators of whether something can be recycled in a typical recycling program.** We encourage you to search for a specific item instead of using the numbers. Our advice is to think about the shape of your plastics. If they are clean and empty plastic bottles, jars, jugs or tubs, they are what we are looking for! These numbers however can be used to exclude items, regardless of the shape. Please **exclude numbers 6 & 7 in all forms from your recycle bin.**

# BALD HILL COMPOST SITE - SEASONAL

## Permits Required - Permits NOT sold at Bald Hill Location (see below)

The compost site accepts grass clippings, green garden waste, leaves, acorns, pine needles and cones.

- You are responsible for removing the materials from your vehicle
- **No plastic bags** of any kind allowed; only paper yard waste bags can be left at the site
- Andover Residents Only—no commercial/business waste
- **No stumps, roots, rocks, stones, sod, soil, dirt, or mulch**

## The site also accepts brush/branches as outlined below:

- Maximum length of 4' (4 feet)
- Maximum diameter 6" (six inch)
- Must not contain cables, cable anchors, nails or any other metal objects

**Each season/year starts in early April, ends early December, weather permitting**

**Permit Costs \$25 (1 yr.) or \$75 (3 yr.). Permits valid until last day of season indicated on sticker.**

A Permit is required to drop off leaves, grass clippings and brush, as well as to pick up compost and wood chips. Permits can be obtained at the Municipal Services Facility located at 5 Campanelli Drive, from 8 am to 3:30 pm, cash or check only; no credit or debit cards accepted. **A valid vehicle registration must be presented at the time of purchase each season, no exceptions.** If your vehicle's registration lists something other than your home address, please also bring/send proof of residency (e.g. copy of a tax bill).

## APPLIANCES & WHITE GOODS

Large household appliances are **not** allowed with regular trash nor are they recyclable curbside.

They include but are not limited to: refrigerators, stoves, wall ovens, grills\*, washers, dryers, dishwashers, heaters, air-conditioners, humidifiers/de-humidifiers, hot water heaters, microwaves, etc.

Residents are responsible for appliance disposal and payment. Check under Private Disposal Options on page 11, in local advertisements or search online.

## CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS

Construction & Demolition Debris (C&D), is banned from the waste stream and will not be collected curbside. C&D consists of but is not limited to: asphalt, brick, concrete, cabinetry, windows, doors, skylights, roofing, sheetrock, siding, all fences, electric wiring, radiators/baseboard heaters, insulation, piping, etc.

You will need to make arrangements with either your contractor to dispose of the waste or privately contract with a disposal service. A list of **Private Disposal Options** is shown on page 11.

**Asbestos** is required to be disposed of via a licensed Asbestos contractor. For more information you can visit [www.mass.gov/dep](http://www.mass.gov/dep)

## ELECTRONICS / E-WASTE

No drop-off besides the annual CRT & Electronics collection (see page 9). Contact retailer or manufacturer for recycling options, or search for waste disposal facilities/services that accept electronic waste. Metal scrappers/recyclers often take back some electronics. CRT (cathode-ray tube) TV's and monitors require special handling so be sure to confirm your items are acceptable.

## FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

Quality fire extinguishers (most are metal) in good condition can be recharged. Inexpensive fire extinguishers (most are plastic) and those in poor condition cannot be recharged. Search "Fire Extinguishers" online for a company that can recharge or call your local hardware store to see if they offer this service. For metal extinguishers, contact a local metal salvage facility. Not accepted Curbside or at Special Collections.

## FLUORESCENT BULBS (INCLUDING CFLs)

- No regular curbside or drop-off available in Andover
- Check with local hardware or home improvement stores for CFL and other fluorescent light drop-off availability and cost

**Bring to HHW/Electronics Collections**

**Incandescent/LED light bulbs are not considered hazardous and can be disposed of in curbside trash**

## LAWN MOWERS/SNOWBLOWERS

Lawn mowers, snowblowers or other oil and gas motorized equipment cannot be put out curbside. View the list of Private Disposal Options shown on page 11, in local advertisements, search online, or Contact a local metal salvage facility.

## METALS

Small quantities of metal will be accepted with regular household trash. Larger quantities are suggested to go to a metal salvage facility.

## PROPANE TANKS

### **Save Water**

Water is a finite resource – even though about 70 percent of the Earth's surface is covered by water, less than 1 percent is available for human use. Despite the water supply and infrastructure challenges faced by many communities across the US, each Andover resident uses an average of 80 gallons of water each day at home, 33% greater than what is considered sustainable within our water basin. Reduce, Reuse, Recycle isn't just for trash and recycling, these practices can help conserve water too. Please do your part to save water at home, inside and out. ### **Help Keep Our Storm Drains Clean**

The Town is continuing to implement a Stormwater Management Program to improve water quality by reducing the discharge of pollutants from storm water runoff into local storm drains, rivers, ponds, streams and other receiving waterbodies. The following information is provided as part of the Public Education component.

#### **ILLICIT DISCHARGE DETECTION AND ELIMINATION**

##### **What is an illicit discharge?**

An illicit discharge is the discharge of pollutants or non-stormwater materials into a storm drain system via overland flow, direct dumping, or illegal connections. Illicit discharges may be a result of industrial activity, deposits of oil on parking lots, excess lawn fertilizer and yard clippings, and a variety of other sources which pollute water with turbidity, excess nutrients, and bacteria. Illicit discharges can also be from failing septic systems or improperly connected sewer lines. Dumping anything other than stormwater into a storm drain allows these pollutants to enter lakes and streams causing public health concerns, harm to wildlife, and unpleasant odors or color. Developing an illicit discharge detection and elimination program (IDDE) to find and eliminate these sources is mandated by the US EPA under the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit.

##### **Sources of Illicit Discharges**

- Sanitary wastewater (sewage)
- Septic tank waste or overflows
- Car wash, laundry, and industrial wastewaters
- Improper disposal of auto and household toxics, such as motor oil, antifreeze, and pesticides
- Spills on roadways and other accidents

##### **How can you help?**

- Never dump anything down a storm drain
- Dispose of yard and pet waste properly
- Avoid excess use of pesticides and lawn fertilizers
- Wash your car at a car wash facility
- Make sure sanitary, laundry, carwash, and industrial wastewaters do not drain to the storm drain system
- Have your septic tank pumped and inspected at least once every two years
